# Best beds: The Seychelles

Dip into the finest boltholes in this Indian Ocean nation, from beachfront bargains to fab private



Laid-back pad

Avani Barbarons

Chic doubles from £145, B&B

(avanihotels.com)

Appealingly alone on a long horseshoe beach on the west coast of main island Mahé. It's just 30 minutes from the airport (which is why so many flight crews stay here).

Laid-back, low-slung and loungey: there are beanbags by the pool, a sand-floored restaurant — and a youngish crowd.

Simple but stylish. Everything's on two floors, so specify whether you want a balcony (better views, more privacy) or terrace (walk right out to the pool).

Room Nos. 170-184 are the quietest.

Rooftop bar, open-sided buffet restaurant, poolside coconut shack — the surroundings are great, the food's not bad.

With spreading gardens and that lo-o-ong beach, it's really easy to find yourself a quiet private spot (not always the case at this price in the Seychelles).

Roughish waves — and coral beneath them — mean that this bit of **Indian Ocean is more for looking at than paddling in**.

Romantic gesture? Sorted. A nearby stables can arrange horse-riding along the beach (from £92; turquoisehorsetrails.com).



#### Desert-island deluxe Four Seasons Desroches

Doubles start at £587, B&B, but that's on the rocky side of this **secluded private island**— £649 bags you a Beach Bungalow on the lovely, soft-sand side (fourseasons com)



(Mahé's 35 minutes away by £400 prop jet.)

Billionaire recluse seeks quiet time. You're on a 6km-long island, with 14km of beach, and only a couple of hundred other people — most of whom are here to serve you.

Sophisticated (cool polished stone and tropical woods), but with castaway touches such as pinchable mismatched straw hats.

A little low on variety, extremely high on quality. The Lighthouse bar, perched halfway up one, might be the country's best sunset cocktail spot.

Free bikes + deli for picnic materials + **dozens of secluded beaches** + thick palm forest = not having to see another soul all day.

The resort's only a year old, so the vegetation around the rooms is still growing — which means they're **not as private as** they **might be**. Room Nos. 1-12, in particular, are pretty public.

Can't be bothered to cycle back from the beach? **Use the 'emergency' phone** to call for a golf buggy. Staff don't mind, we promise!



#### Where the cool gang goes Six Senses Zil Pasyon

Doubles cost from £1,016, B&B. **Spendier** villas are essentially the same, but with nicer—and we mean reallynice—views (sixsenses.com).

Onits own virgin-forested islet, Félicité. **Getting here is part of the fun:** choose little plane, car and speedboat, or helicopter.

Posh-piratical. It's quiet and stylish, but with a fun, raffish edge. Think five-star service on first-name terms (even Ms Hurley was 'Liz' when she stayed).

Strewnhiggledy-piggledy among the palms, and semi-stitled on the hill slopes, they pack plunge pool, sun deck, swingseat in the bathroom and loads more fun stuff into a sleek, sexy space.

Perfectly pitched: meat-free Ocean Kitchen does zingingly fresh seafood, while lantern-bedecked Island Cafe does Creole fusion. Then there's the honesty rumbar...

A spa Lara Croft might have designed: perched above the waves, tucked between giant boulders, approached via rope bridge, and with its own clifftop infinity pool.

# The main beach is a bit rough...

...but there are tiny **secret beaches**. Ask staff for directions to Anse Pasyon or — If they really like you — Anse Poppet.

## Petite retreat Anse Soleil Beachcomber

Refreshingly, rates here stay the same year-round: Standard rooms go for £115 ('Superior' and 'Premier' aren't worth the extra: ansesoleilbeachcomber.com).

On Mahé's west coast, but at **the end of the road**. So no-one comes past (good), but it's a decent drive to get anywhere (not so good).

Once a retreat for Catholic priests, it's still as sleepy as a Sunday. No pool, no spa, no frills — but a perfect, tranquil little beach.

Plain, square, white-painted rooms with little verandas looking out over the bay. Room Nos. 3, 5 and 10 are the quietest.



The bar/restaurant has some nice Creole options, but best is its overwater terrace for angelfish sightings beneath.

### That beach – at that price

You're a **bit trapped here without a car** (the only other place on the beach is Chez Julien, better known for its somewhat unpredictable owner than for its food).

Go soon — there are plans for building works next year — but avoid December, when the sea is rough here.



# Family favourite Constance Ephelia

You can get a double from £272, B&B, but, as with most hotels in the Seychelles, you'll get better deals through a tour operator (constancehotels.com).

On a broad spit of land — with wide beaches on either side — in northwest Mahé.



Family fun. There's loads to do (zipline, kayak tour, giant tortoise feeding...). Local kids love the beaches, too, which **keeps things lively**.

Well put-together, in calm neutrals.
Cleverly, they're clustered around a set of small swimming pools (there's no big main one) so things never get really noisy.

### Book early for its 'signature' restos

or you'll end up at the buffet every night.

You're much less cut off than at most resorts; you can walk to local cafes, chat to villagers on the beach and catch a bus into the capital...

Towels! In the name of 'eco', they're rationed and have to be schlepped around with you from room to beach and back. No funif you're ferrying your whole family's wet ones...

Get someone to point out the river's wading point and the 1km path up to the **swimmable local secret**, the Sauzier Waterfall.
